NEW INFORMATION:

On February 3, 2005, the City Council set the protest hearing date and adopted a resolution declaring the Notice of Intention for the 900 South 900 East, streetscape upgrade Special Improvement District, Job No. 106018. The next step is for the Council to hold a protest hearing. In order for the District to be created, the protest rate must be less than 50 percent of the property owners who submitted written protests to the City Recorder by the March 7th deadline. Protest information filed at the Recorder's Office will be provided to the City Council on the day of the protest hearing.

POTENTIAL MOTIONS:

1. ["I move that the Council"] Close the protest hearing for the 900 East 900 South Streetscape Upgrade, Special Improvement District No. 106018 and refer to Engineering for tabulation.

The following information was provided previously. It is provided again for Council's reference.

KEY ELEMENTS: (Resolution)

On November 9, 2004, the City Council finalized the capital improvement program (CIP) budget for fiscal year 2004-05. Included in the CIP budget was \$500,000 for the 900 South & 900 East Streetscape project, which was contingent upon Neighborhood SID Approval. As the first step in creating the process to establish the Special Improvement District (SID), the Administration is requesting that the Council adopt a resolution declaring the Notice of Intention and set the protest hearing date for March 8, 2005. SID boundary includes all property

fronting or abutting on both sides of 900 South from Windsor Street (860 East) to 1000 East. The Engineering Division has identified an estimated 26 parcels as part of the proposed SID, however some property owners own more than one parcel, therefore approximately 15 property owners will be involved with the proposed SID. All properties are commercial. The project is being coordinated with the Public Utilities Department for installation of storm drainage improvements for the project.

The Notice of Intention states that "The proposed improvements include the reconstruction of the roadway pavement; and the construction and installation of concrete angle parking, concrete curbs, sidewalks, driveway approaches, median islands, sidewalk ramps, storm drainage facilities, site furnishing, street lighting, traffic signals, landscaping, and miscellaneous work."

Depending upon the nature of the improvements, costs will be assessed by front foot (lot width) of abutting property. Each property owner will receive information with the Notice of Intention of an estimated assessment calculation made by the City Engineer's Office.

The Administration reports that existing curb, gutter, and angle parking are deteriorated and in poor condition and will be replaced as part of the City's expense portion. Although sidewalks are in good condition and do not need to be replaced, there is the exception of sidewalk areas near the intersection which will also be replaced at the City's expense for the beautification project.

Costs that will be assessed to the property owners include: areas that lack cut-back angle parking and for the beautification amenities associated with the project (decorative concrete, decorative street lighting, landscaped medians, and site furnishing upgrades). There are no options being offered to the property owners who may want to have additional work performed in conjunction with the proposed SID improvements.

Following Council's approval of the attached resolution, a Notice of Intention informational letter and a preliminary estimate will immediately be sent to property owners within the boundary areas of the proposed SID (a copy of a letter that will be sent to property owners is attached) notifying property owners that the City is considering a proposed SID for reconstruction of 900 South from Windsor Street to 1000 East.

It is projected that the project may begin in May with completion by fall of 2005.

KEY DATES:

Informal public meetings were scheduled for March 2, 2005 for the Administration to review the proposed SID with interested abutting property owners. The meeting location was the Forest Dale Golf Course, 2375 South 900 East, from 4:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m.

Written protests against the proposed improvements, assessments or against the creation of the District must be presented and filed in the Office of the City Recorder on or before 5:00 p.m. on March 7, 2005, followed by a Council protest hearing on Tuesday, March 8, 2005 at 7:00 p.m.

Upcoming action before the Council will include:

- Resolution creating the Special Improvement District and resolution accepting a bid for construction work.
- Resolution appointing a Board of Equalization and setting the date for the Board of Equalization hearing.

- Ordinance confirming the assessment rolls and levying assessments.
- Resolution authorizing the issuance and providing the sale of bonds.

BUDGET RELATED FACTS:

The City Engineer has estimated that the total cost of improvements in the proposed District is \$1,502,000. It is anticipated the City's portion will be approximately \$1,140,000 (includes approximately \$249,000 from the Public Utilities Department to pay for drainage improvements and \$96,000 from the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development). The property owners' portion is estimated to be approximately \$362,000 (includes construction costs, a portion of engineering expenses, possibly a portion for debt service reserve, an allowance for interest on interim warrants issued to finance construction of the improvements and 15 percent for administrative costs).

Estimated breakdown costs to property owners are as follows:

The majority of City funding sources are allocated from the Salt Lake City Capital Improvement budget Class "C" funds (\$500,000 was appropriated during the 2004-05 CIP process contingent upon the property owners being in favor of the SID), a Federal Economic Development Initiative Grant , Salt Lake City Public Utilities Department, and with the remaining costs of the improvements paid by a special assessment to be levied against the property fronting or abutting upon or adjacent to the improvements. It is anticipated that the first payment of an assessment installment may be less than one year from the date the Council adopts the assessment ordinance; thereafter approximately ten assessment installments will fall on the anniversary date of the first assessment payment, rather than five years as is calculated for concrete replacement SIDs.

MATTERS AT ISSUE/POTENTIAL QUESTIONS FOR ADMINISTRATION:

- 1. According to the Engineering Division, a Notice of Intention letter is prepared and copies for the property owners are made ahead of time prior to the City Council considering the Notice of Intention. Making copies ahead of time ensures that the letters are ready to be sent to property owners immediately following the Council's adoption of the resolution. Council staff wishes to point this out only because during the last SID Notice of Intention briefing held by the Council, a suggestion was made by a Council Member to modify the Notice of Intention letter with the intent to ensure the letter clearly reflected the improvements the property owners were being assessed for. The Administration revised the letter but at the expense of having to recopy the letter for all the property owners.
- 2. During the design phase, a sight-impaired District Five resident had significant concerns with the plans when a round-about was included. He is pleased that it has been removed, but is still cautious to ensure that the design elements be completely accessible to ensure that there are no dangers for sight or hearing impaired individuals.

FUNDING: Monies are provided from the Salt Lake City Capital Improvement budget Class "C" Road Funds, a Federal Economic Development Initiative Grant, Salt Lake City Public Utilities Department, and property owner assessments through the Special Improvement District.

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION: The 900 East 900 South Streetscape Improvement project involves the reconstruction and beautification of the roadway, park strip and sidewalks. The improvements include replacing deteriorated concrete, landscaped median islands, decorative sidewalks, enhanced street lighting, additional on-street parking and traffic signal upgrades. The project extends from Windsor Street to 1000 East. The project is being coordinated with Public Utilities for storm drain improvements.

Construction of the project is scheduled to start in May of 2005 with completion by fall 2005.

Attached is an information sheet, the Notice of Intention and a schedule of hearings and meetings.

INFORMATION SHEET 900 SOUTH 900 EAST STREETSCAPE UPGRADE SPECIAL IMPROVEMNENT DISTRICT JOB NO. 106018

DESCRIPTION OF IMPROVEMENTS:

The 900 South 900 East Streetscape Upgrade project involves the reconstruction and beautification of the roadway, lighting, parking areas and sidewalks at the 900 South 900 East intersection. The improvements include resurfacing the roadway, replacing deteriorated concrete, landscaped median islands and park strips, decorative sidewalks, street furnishing, raised planters, enhanced street and pedestrian scale lighting, additional on-street angle parking and traffic signal upgrades. The project extends from Windsor Street to 1000 East. The project is being coordinated with Pubic Utilities for installation storm drainage improvements for the project.

AVAILABLILITY OF FUNDS:

Funding is available from City General and Class "C" funds, Federal Economic Development Initiative funding from the US Department of Housing and Urban Development, Public Utilities storm drainage funds and property owner assessments through the Special Improvement District.

After the meeting had been duly called to order and other matters not pertinent to this resolution had been discussed, the City Recorder presented to the Council a Certificate of Compliance with Open Meeting Law with respect to this 1st day of February, 2005, meeting, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A.

Thereupon the following proceedings, among others, were duly had and taken:

The following resolution was introduced in writing, was read by title and Councilmember _____ moved its adoption:

RESOLUTION NO. ___of 2005

A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE INTENTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF SALT LAKE CITY, SALT LAKE COUNTY, UTAH, TO CONSTRUCT IMPROVEMENTS WITHIN THE CITY CONSISTING OF THE RECONSTRUCTION OF ROADWAY PAVEMENT, AND TO CONSTRUCT AND INSTALL CONCRETE ANGLE PARKING, CONCRETE CURBS, SIDEWALKS, DRIVEWAY APPROACHES, MEDIAN ISLANDS, SIDEWALK RAMPS, STORM DRAINAGE FACILITIES, SITE FURNISHING, STREET LIGHTING, TRAFFIC SIGNALS, LANDSCAPING, AND ALL OTHER MISCELLANEOUS WORK NECESSARY TO COMPLETE THE IMPROVEMENTS IN A PROPER AND WORKMANLIKE MANNER; TO CREATE THE SALT LAKE CITY, UTAH 900 SOUTH, 900 EAST, STREETSCAPE UPGRADE SPECIAL IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 106018 (THE "DISTRICT"); TO PAY THE ACQUISITION AND INSTALLATION COSTS AND EXPENSES BY SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS TO BE LEVIED AGAINST THE PROPERTY BENEFITED BY SUCH IMPROVEMENTS; TO PROVIDE NOTICE OF INTENTION TO AUTHORIZE SUCH IMPROVEMENTS AND TO FIX A TIME AND PLACE FOR PROTESTS AGAINST SUCH IMPROVEMENTS. ASSESSMENTS CREATION OF THE DISTRICT; TO DECLARE THE CITY'S OFFICIAL INTENT TO REIMBURSE ITSELF FOR EXPENDITURES PAID BY IT PRIOR TO THE SALE OF BONDS: AND AUTHORIZE ŢΟ ADVERTISEMENT OF CONSTRUCTION BIDS AND RELATED MATTERS.

BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of Salt Lake City, Salt Lake County, Utah (the "City"), as follows:

Section 1. The City Council hereby determines that it will be in the best interest of the City to reconstruct roadway pavement, and to construct and install concrete angle parking, concrete curbs, sidewalks, driveway approaches, median islands, sidewalk ramps, storm drainage facilities, site furnishing, street lighting, traffic signals, landscaping and all other miscellaneous work necessary to complete the whole in a proper and workmanlike manner (collectively, the "Improvements") according to plans on file in the Office of the City Engineer in Salt Lake City, Utah. To finance the costs of the Improvements, the City Council proposes to create and establish a special improvement district. A description of the proposed Improvements and special improvement district is more particularly described in the Notice of Intention hereinafter set forth.

Section 2. The proposed special improvement district shall be known as "Salt Lake City, Utah 900 South, 900 East Streetscape Upgrade Special Improvement District No. 106018" (the "District").

Section 3. The costs of the proposed Improvements shall be paid by a special assessment to be levied against the property fronting or abutting upon or adjacent to the

Improvements or which may be affected or specially benefited by any of such Improvements. The costs shall be paid in not more than ten (10) annual installments with interest on the unpaid balance until due and paid.

Written protests against the proposed Improvements, assessments or against the creation of the District must be presented and filed in the Office of the Chief Deputy City Recorder on or before 5:00 p.m. on the 7th day of March, 2005. Thereafter at 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, the 8th day of March, 2005, at 451 South State Street, Salt Lake City, Utah, any such protests shall be heard and considered by the City Council. The City Recorder is hereby directed to give notice of the City's intention to install the proposed Improvements and to assess for the costs thereof and of the time within which protests against the proposed Improvements, the proposed assessments or the creation of the District may be filed and the date when such protests will be heard and considered by publishing a notice of intention to create the District (the "Notice of Intention") in the Deseret Morning News, a newspaper of general circulation in the City, said Notice of Intention to be published four times, once during each week for four consecutive weeks, the last publication to be not less than five (5) nor more than twenty (20) days prior to the time fixed in the Notice of Intention as the last day for the filing of protests. In addition, the City Recorder shall mail a copy of the Notice of Intention by United States Mail, postage prepaid, to each owner of land to be assessed within the proposed District at the last known address of such owner, using for such purpose the names and addresses of said owners appearing on the last completed real property assessment rolls of Salt Lake County, Utah. In addition, a copy of the Notice of Intention shall be mailed, postage prepaid, addressed to "Owner" at the street number of each piece of improved property, if any, to be affected by the assessment, said Notice to be so mailed not later than ten (10) days after the first publication of the Notice of Intention. If a street number has not been so assigned, then the post office box, rural route number, or any other mailing address of the improved property shall be used for the mailing of the Notice of Intention. Said Notice of Intention shall be in substantially the following form:

NOTICE OF INTENTION

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on Tuesday, the 1st day of February, 2005, the Mayor and the City Council of Salt Lake City, Utah (the "City Council"), adopted a resolution declaring the City's intention to create a special improvement district to be known as the Salt Lake City, Utah 900 South, 900 East Streetscape Upgrade Special Improvement District No. 106018 (the "District"). It is the intention of the City Council to install improvements within or adjacent to the District, to operate and maintain said improvements and to levy special assessments as provided in Title 17A, Chapter 3, Part 3, Utah Code Annotated 1953, as amended, on the real estate lying within the District for the benefit of which such assessments are to be assessed in the making of such improvements.

DESCRIPTION OF DISTRICT

The proposed District will be created and improvements will be constructed within the boundaries of Salt Lake City, Utah. The District boundary includes all property fronting or abutting on both sides of 900 South Street from Windsor Street to 1000 East Street.

PROPOSED IMPROVEMENTS

The proposed improvements include the reconstruction of the roadway pavement, and the construction and installation of concrete angle parking, concrete curbs, sidewalks, driveway approaches, median islands, sidewalk ramps, storm drainage facilities, site furnishing, street lighting, traffic signals, landscaping, and miscellaneous work (collectively, the "Improvements").

The Improvements will generally be located as follows:

900 South: from 900 East to Windsor Street

North Side Frontage:

Beginning at the west right-of-way line of 900 East Street, thence west 329.69 feet.

South Side Frontage:

Beginning at the west right-of-way line of 900 East Street, thence west 326.00 feet to the east right-of-way line of Windsor Street.

900 South: from 900 East to Lincoln Street

North Side Frontage:

Beginning at the east right-of-way line of 900 East Street, thence east 297.00 feet to the west right-of-way line of Lincoln Street.

South Side Frontage:

Beginning at the east right-of-way line of 900 East Street, thence east 330.00 feet to the west right-of-way line of Lincoln Street.

900 South: from Lincoln Street to 1000 Street

North Side Frontage:

Beginning at the east right-of-way line of Lincoln Street, thence east 297.00 feet to the west right-of-way line of 1000 East Street.

South Side Frontage:

Beginning at the east right-of-way line of Lincoln Street, thence east 157,00 feet.

BASIS FOR ASSESSMENT

The property owners whose property will be improved will be assessed for a portion of the cost of the Improvements. Depending on the nature of the Improvements, costs will be assessed by lineal front foot of abutting property. For a designation of the applicable rates and methods of assessment, see "Estimated Cost of Improvements" set out hereafter.

The City Engineer's office will calculate the estimated assessment for each parcel to be assessed and that information will be provided for each property owner in a memorandum which will be mailed, together with a copy of this Notice of Intention, to each property owner. In addition, a tabulation of the assessments by individual parcel will be available together with a map of the District in the City Engineer's Office. Also available at that office will be a list of all properties to be assessed and the preliminary plans, profiles and specifications of the Improvements.

ESTIMATED COST OF IMPROVEMENTS

The total cost of Improvements in the proposed District as estimated by the City Engineer is \$1,502,000, of which the City is anticipated to pay approximately \$1,140,000 (the "City's Portion," including approximately \$249,000 from the Public Utilities Department of the City to pay for drainage improvements and \$96,000 from the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development). The remainder of

approximately \$362,000 (the "Property Owners' portion of the Improvements) plus administration costs shall be paid by a special assessment to be levied against the property abutting upon the streets to be improved or upon property which may be affected or specifically benefited by such Improvements. The actual commitment of the City to pay the City's portion of the cost of Improvements is subject to the availability of funds and compliance with the City's budget requirements.

The estimated property owners' costs include construction costs and a portion of engineering expenses, possibly a portion of a debt service reserve, an allowance for the interest on interim warrants issued to finance construction of the Improvements and an allowance of fifteen percent (15%) for administrative costs including underwriter's discount on sale of bonds, legal and other costs in connection with the issuance of bonds. The estimated cost to be assessed against the properties within the District shall be as follows:

The proposed assessment will be equal and uniform based on benefits received. The adjustment for the City's Portion has been taken into account in the Table above so that the Estimated Cost per front footage represents the net estimated cost to be assessed to the property owner.

LEVY OF ASSESSMENTS

The proposed assessment rates shall be paid by a special assessment to be levied against the property abutting the streets to be improved and upon property which may be affected or specifically benefited by such Improvements. The rates will be equal and uniform based on benefits received, but under the Salt Lake City Code, the City's portion varies depending on factors such as the use of the properties to be assessed.

The adjustment for the City's portion has been taken into account in the table above so that the estimated cost per unit represents the net estimated cost to be assessed to the property owners.

It is the intention of the City to levy assessments as provided by the laws of the State of Utah on all parcels and lots of real property within the District benefiting from the Improvements. The purpose of the assessments and levy is to pay the costs of the

proposed Improvements. The method of assessment for the Improvements shall be by lineal front feet or square feet as set forth herein.

Assessments may be paid by property owners in ten (10) approximately equal annual installments. To fund the first semiannual interest payment on assessment bonds of the District, the first payment date of an assessment installment may be less than one year from the date of adoption of the assessment ordinance. Thereafter, assessment installments will fall due on the anniversary date of the first assessment payment date. Interest will accrue on the unpaid balance at a rate or rates to be fixed by the City Treasurer. The whole or any part of the assessment may be paid without interest within fifteen (15) days after the ordinance levying the assessment becomes effective. The assessments shall be levied according to the benefits to be derived by each property owner within the District. Other payment provisions and enforcement remedies shall be in accordance with Title 17A, Chapter 3, Part 3, Utah Code Annotated 1953, as amended.

TIME FOR FILING PROTESTS

Any person who is the owner of record of property to be assessed in the District described in this Notice of Intention shall have the right to file in writing a protest against the creation of the District or to make any other objections relating thereto. Protests shall describe or otherwise identify the property owned of record by the person or persons making the protest and shall indicate the total front footage represented by said protest. Protests shall be filed with the City Recorder of Salt Lake City, Utah, on or before 5:00 p.m. on the 7th day of March, 2005. Thereafter at 7:00 p.m. on the 8th day of March, 2005, the City Council of Salt Lake City, Utah, will meet in public meeting at the offices of the City Council to consider all protests so filed and hear all objections relating to the proposed District.

Protests shall not have any effect on the determination of the existence of defective concrete under the Salt Lake City Code and the responsibility imposed by said Ordinance for replacement of such defective concrete.

CALCULATION OF PROTEST RATE

A protest rate shall be determined by aggregating the total of lineal feet for proposed Improvements for the assessable property of all property owners filing written protests and dividing it by the total aggregate lineal feet of Improvements of all property owners to be assessed within the proposed District. After the protest hearing, the City Council may delete properties of protesting owners from the District resulting in a modification of the District (the "Modified District"). At the time of creation of the District, the written protests of property owners in any area not included in the District will not be used in determining the protest rates. The City Council will rescind its intention to create the District if the Protest Rate exceeds fifty percent (50%) of all of the lineal feet of property to be assessed within the District or the property remaining in the Modified District.

- Section 5. The City Council reasonably expects, and hereby confirms its prior expressions of intent, to reimburse the City from proceeds of tax exempt assessment bonds for capital expenditures paid by the City (whether or not such expenditures are paid from proceeds of interim warrants) with respect to the Improvements.
- Section 6. This declaration is intended to be a declaration of official intent under Treasury Regulation § 1.103-18(1).
- Section 7. The maximum principal amount of debt expected to be issued for reimbursement purposes is \$362,000. This amount may be reduced by cash payments received by the City from property owners who elect to pay their assessment in whole or in part during the cash payment period immediately following the effective date of the assessment ordinance.
- Section 8. This declaration of official intent is consistent with the City's budgetary and financial circumstances. No funds from sources other than tax exempt assessment bonds are, or are reasonably expected to be, reserved, allocated on a long-term basis, or otherwise set aside by the Council or by any member of the same controlled group pursuant to their budget or financial policies with respect to the expenditures to be reimbursed.
- Section 9. The City Engineer is hereby authorized to prepare notices which call for bids for the furnishing of materials and the acquisition and installation of Improvements contemplated to be made in the District, and the City Recorder is hereby authorized to publish such notices calling for bids as least one time in the Deseret Morning News, a newspaper of general circulation in Salt Lake City, at least fifteen (15) days before the date specified in the notice for the receipt of bids.

We wish to inform you of the proposed streetscape project on 900 South from Windsor Street to 1000 East. Your property along 900 South is included in the proposed project. This Streetscape Special Improvement District will consist of enhancing the pedestrian environment, traffic calming, streetscape beautification, reconstruction of roadway pavement, curb and gutter, sidewalks, ramps, and cutback parking. Upgrade of 900 East intersection traffic signals and decorative street lights; installation of additional cut back parking and landscape median islands; and the addition of site furnishings, drainage facilities and other miscellaneous work will also be included.

The work will be funded using City funds, Federal Economic Development Initiative funds, and property owner assessments through a Special Improvement District. Information concerning the Special Improvement District is included with this letter. The City and Federal portion of the funding for the improvements will pay the cost of removing and replacing the existing curb and gutter, milling the existing asphalt, placing an asphalt overlay, 900 South 900 East intersection reconstruction, drainage, traffic signals, and associated items. The Property Owner portion of the project cost includes decorative concrete, decorative street lighting, added cut-back angle parking, landscaped medians, and site furnishing upgrades.

The following attachments are for your information and use:

- 1. The Notice of Intention describes how a Special Improvement District is created and operates. The notice outlines the costs for the work and describes how you may protest the project if you disagree with it.
- 2. The preliminary estimate of the assessment for your property is based on the quantity of work and width of your property.

As the property owner of record, you have the right to file a written protest against the creation of the 900 East 900 South Streetscape Upgrade Special Improvement District, Job No. 106018 or make any other objections relating thereto. Protests shall describe or otherwise identify the property being protested. Protests shall be filed with the City Recorder of Salt Lake City, Utah on or before 5:00 p.m. on the 7th day of March, 2005. The City Council will meet on the 8th of March, 2005 at 7:00 p.m. in a public meeting at the City Council Chamber

The protest rate shall be determined by totaling the assessable front footage of property owners filing written protest divided by the total assessable front footage of properties included in the special improvement district. After the written protest rate has been determined, the City Council may, at its discretion, delete areas from the district. The City Council will rescind its intention to create the district if the total frontage of properties within the boundaries of the district protesting the improvements represents more than fifty percent (50%) of the total assessable front footage of the improvement district.
