Each year, for the past several years, the Department of Public Utilities has contracted with the Forest Service for patrol of the backcountry in Big and Little Cottonwood Canyons. The Forest Service also provides watershed education and protection in the Silver Lake area. On June 4, 2002, the City signed a 5-year contract to continue this effort. The Forest Service requires a separate funding agreement each year to authorize the Forest Service to collect the City's payments. This is the final year of the original 5-year contract, although the City will likely pursue an extension.

# **KEY ELEMENTS:**

The backcountry portion of the agreement provides for two rangers to patrol the City's watershed during the period May 28 through September 5 for a cost of \$15,000. The contracted services at Silver Lake are for an Interpretive Specialist at the Silver Lake Conservation Education Center in Big Cottonwood Canyon who will conduct classes and workshops for the general public and for scheduled groups from May 28, 2006 through September 5, 2006. Interpretive programs will contain watershed protection and conservation messages. The Specialist will also enforce watershed regulations in the Silver Lake area. The cost to the City for this portion of the agreement is \$7,300. A balance of \$627 from the 2004-05 season will also be used for operations at Silver Lake Information Center. These funds will be used to run the Center on weekends in September and to hold classes for school field trips during the weekdays.

The funding, in the amount of \$22,300, is appropriated within the Public Utilities Department. Funds come from water fees; not from the General Fund. The balance of \$627 is remaining in the account from previous seasons. The total funding the Forest Service will use during 2006 is \$22,927.

A Council resolution is required for this interlocal agreement because it meets one of the seven criteria (agreement with an out-of-state agency). Under amendments made by the 2003 Legislation to the Interlocal Cooperative Act, City Council action is not required except when the interlocal agreement includes any of the following:

- Acquires or transfers real property
- Construction of a facility or improvements to real property
- Bonding
- Sharing taxes or other revenue
- Agreements that includes an out-of-state public agency
- Agreements that require budget adjustments to the City's current or future budgets
- Creation of an interlocal agency

<u>Discussion</u>: On June 4, 2002, the City signed a 5-year Collection Agreement with the USDA Forest Service, Wasatch-Cache National Forest for the protection of City watersheds in the backcountry portion of National Forest Lands in Big and Little Cottonwood Canyons. The agreement requires approval of a yearly financial plan based on available budget. The City will contribute to the forest service \$22,300.00 for the year 2006. Fifteen thousand dollars will be used for the backcountry areas and \$7,300.00 for watershed education and protection in the Silver Lake area. In addition, \$627.00 balance from 2004/2005 season is to be for operations at Silver Lake Information Center.

For Year 2006, Salt Lake City Corporation shall contribute to the Forest Service **\$22,300.00**. Of the total, \$15,000.00 will be used for City watershed protection in the backcountry areas and \$7,300.00 for watershed education and protection in the Silver Lake area during the summer, 2006 season. Exact operating season is dependent upon snow levels.

This Financial Plan funds 2 Backcountry Rangers and 1 Interpretive Specialist at Silver Lake. Grade level and financed days may vary slightly dependent upon who is hired for positions.

### COLLECTION AGREEMENT between USDA FOREST SERVICE, WASTACH-CACHE NATIONAL FOREST and SALT LAKE CITY CORPORATION

This COLLECTION AGREEMENT is hereby entered into by and between the USDA Forest Service, Wasatch-Cache National Forest, hereinafter referred to as the Forest Service, and Salt Lake City Corporation, hereinafter referred to as the City, under the provisions of the Cooperative Funds Act of June 30, 1914 (16 USC 498).

#### A. PURPOSE:

The purpose of this agreement is to provide watershed protection on National Forest System lands within the designated City watershed. The agreement will fund Backcountry Rangers who will complete resource protection projects, educate visitors, and enforce City watershed regulations in Big and Little Cottonwood Canyons. The number of Backcountry Rangers will be shown on the annual Financial Plan.

The agreement will also fund an Interpretive Specialist at Silver Lake Conservation Education Center in Big Cottonwood Canyon who will conduct classes and workshops for the general public and for scheduled groups such as area schools. Interpretive programs will contain watershed protection and conservation messages. The Interpretive Specialist will also enforce watershed regulations in the Silver Lake area.

#### B. FOREST SERVICE SHALL:

1. Bill the cooperator prior to commencement of work for deposits sufficient to cover the estimated costs for the specific payment period. Overhead will not be assessed.

2. Deposit all cash funds received under the terms of this Agreement to a Forest Service Cooperative Work Fund to be used for the purpose for which contributed.

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3. Hire, train, and supervise personnel. Provide transportation and equipment needed for water protection projects and visitor education.

4. Complete a final report of project accomplishments by the termination of this agreement.

5. Keep financial records to validate work performed and disposition of funds.

#### C. THE CITY SHALL:

1. Contribute to the Forest Service annually to assist the Forest Service in providing watershed protection on National Forest System lands within the designated City watershed. Amount will be identified in an annual Financial Plan.

# D. IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED AND UNDERSTOOD BY ALL PARTIES THAT:

1. <u>TAXPAYER IDENTIFICATION NUMBER</u>. The cooperator shall furnish their tax identification number upon execution of this instrument.

2. <u>FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT (FOLA)</u>. Any information furnished to the Forest Service under this instrument is subject to the Freedom of Information Act (5 U.S.C. 552).

3. <u>MODIFICATION</u>. Modifications within the scope of the instrument shall be made by mutual consent of the parties, by the issuance of a written modification, signed and dated by all parties, prior to any changes being performed.

The Forest Service is not obligated to fund any changes not properly approved in advance.

4. <u>REFUNDS</u>. Contributions authorized for use by the Forest Service, which are not spent or obligated for the project(s) approved under this instrument, will be refunded to the cooperator or authorized for use for new projects by the cooperator and approved by the Forest Service.

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5. <u>PROPERTY IMPROVEMENTS</u>. Improvements placed on National Forest System land at the direction of either of the parties, shall thereupon become property of the United States, and shall be subject to the same regulations and administration of the Forest Service as other National Forest improvements of a similar nature. No part of this instrument shall entitle the cooperator to any share or interest in the project other than the right to use and enjoy the same under the existing regulations of the Forest Service.

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6. <u>LEGAL AUTHORITY</u>. The cooperator has the legal authority to enter into this instrument, and the institutional, managerial and financial capability (including funds sufficient to pay nonfederal share of project costs) to ensure proper planning, management, and completion of the project.

7. <u>PARTICIPATION IN SIMILAR ACTIVITIES</u>. This instrument in no way restricts the Forest Service or the City from participating in similar activities with other public or private agencies, organizations, and individuals.

8. <u>COMMENCEMENT/EXPIRATION DATE</u>. The instrument is executed as of the date of the last signature and is effective through December 31, 2007 at which time it will expire unless extended.

9. <u>TERMINATION</u>. Any of the parties, in writing, may terminate the instrument in whole, or in part, at any time before the date of expiration.

Neither party shall incur any new obligations for the terminated portion of the instrument after the effective date and shall cancel as many obligations as possible. Full credit shall be allowed for each Party's expenses and all non-cancelable obligations properly incurred up to the effective date of termination.
