Salt Lake City Legislative Affairs Coordination

- Joint responsibility of City Council and City Administration
- City Administration will take lead in communication/coordination function
- Goal: to speak effectively with "one, consistent voice" on legislative matters
- City effectiveness contingent on "thorough impact analysis" developed for each legislative proposal/action
- City Council members and Mayor should actively participate in legislative process through the City's legislative affairs coordination function
- City Administration will provide means for all involved to effectively coordinate their participation
- The City Council Legislative Subcommittee will respond to urgent legislative matters at the request of the City Administration
- During the legislative session, the Mayor and Council Legislative Subcommittee will meet at least weekly
- City Council will receive weekly updates during the legislative session
- City Attorney and contract lobbyist will represent the City in State legislative processes – including directing the City's participation with the League

- Role of City's legislative affairs coordinator
 - o manage the flow of communications among all persons involved in developing legislative proposals, reacting to legislative proposals, and representing the City with legislative bodies;
 - o relate the City's legislative affairs and analysis to the City's strategic goals and objectives, and to the City's core operational and mission components;
 - o coordinate the creation, approval, and amendment of a City legislative action plan (largely a list of active City legislative interest issues);
 - o assist elected officials and department heads to develop legislative proposals or positions;
 - oversee the monitoring and review of legislative activities that influence or affect City business;
 - o proactively direct City resources to address legislative activity that may affect City business;
 - o provide budget recommendations to achieve the City's legislative objectives;
 - o train key City officials and executives in legislative processes and effective legislative communication;
 - o research and write policy papers relating to City legislative issues; and
 - o participate, with City Attorney and others, in representing the City with legislators and with legislative bodies (and related groups, such as the League and Council of Governments).
