

**Board Re-Appointment: Barbara J. Riley
Community Development & Capital Improvement Programs Advisory
Board.**

INTRODUCTION:

Mayor Becker is recommending that Barbara J. Riley be re-appointed to the Community Development & Capital Improvement Programs Advisory Board. If re-appointed, Ms. Riley will serve the term extending through June 4, 2012.

APPLICANT INFORMATION:

Ms. Riley resides in Salt Lake City, District Two and is currently retired from the Federal Government. Ms. Riley participates in an informal neighborhood watch program in her neighborhood, leads a church group that supplies hygiene items to the homeless and is interested in community development.

CURRENT COMPOSITION:

The Salt Lake City Code requires at least one member to be appointed from each Council district. The Code states that “although members of the committee serve only in an advisory role, their involvement is necessary in order to obtain the opinions of those people who live and work in various neighborhoods to aid the city in identifying the needs within those areas, and projects to be completed with the city’s community development funds.”

Current members are: Robert “Toby” Alires, District 2; Joana “Joey” Behrens, District 1; Michael Bettin, District 4; Shawn Foster, District 5; James Schwing, District 6; Eric Waters, District 3; Megan Rogers, District 1; Barbara Riley, District 2 and John Pace, District 3.

BOARD STRUCTURE:

CDAC, which can have a maximum of fifteen members, provides citizens an opportunity to participate in the City’s planning and assessment of its community development program. CDAC makes recommendations to the Mayor regarding projects that should be completed with Community Development Block Grant funds, evaluates the effectiveness of CDBG program activities, and assures that CDBG goals are consistent with the housing assistance goals of the City.
