Explanation: The City is requesting grant funds to retain the part-time court clerk currently funded under the S.T.O.P Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) Formula 2008 grant and to increase the number of VAWA funded hours for the position from 1,040 hours to 2,080 hours (see second bullet point below for more details.)

GRANT DETAILS:

- The City is requesting grant funds to retain the part-time court clerk currently funded under the S.T.O.P. Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) Formula 2008 grant and to increase the number of VAWA funded hours for the position from 1,040 hours to 2,080 hours.
- Increasing the position from part-time to full-time through grant funds will provide additional personnel resources to improve the effectiveness of the Salt Lake City Domestic Violence Court to process 1,068 misdemeanor domestic violence probation cases each year.
- The full-time court clerk is responsible for:
 1. Providing case management to the 1,068 domestic violence cases on probation with the court annually to monitor offender compliance with court-ordered evaluations for substance-abuse and/or mental health treatment; and
 2. Facilitating the timely issuance of arrest warrants, high-priority service no-contact orders, and violation of no-contact orders for offenders who re-offend or who do not comply with probation.
- The City is contributing a cash match of \$14,374 through the salaries and benefits for the Criminal Section Manager, Court Director, and Court Judge to devote a percentage of effort to the Domestic Violence Court, supervising the VAWA-funded court clerk; and fulfilling the reporting requirements of the funding agency.
