CURRENT COMPOSITION OF THE BOARD:

The Human Rights Commission is comprised of nine members, one representative from each Council District and two from the community who will represent the diversity of the city. All members must be Salt Lake City residents and at least 18 years of age; each will serve a four-year term. Current board members include: Rebecca Hall, District 2; Walter Jones, District 3; Esperanza Granados, District 5; Jennifer Mayer-Glen, District 5; T. Christopher Wharton, District 5; Susan J. Wurtzburg, District 6; Jonathan M. Jepsen, District 7.

BOARD STRUCTURE:

According to City ordinance, the Human Rights Commission makes recommendations to the Mayor and City Council regarding educational resources on issues of discrimination and equal treatment. Commissioners will review complaints of discrimination involving city departments or services to identify possible sources. Reviews legislation, policies or other action by the city designed to further eliminate prejudice and discrimination. The board reviews pending legislation, policy changes or other city action that may impact human rights and works in partnership to foster positive inter-group relations through educational programs.
